In his remarks to the group Unger said the city needs to initiate additional broad-based affordable housing construction, particularly in close proximity to the railroad station, a major transportation hub for workers. He also proposed that the city work aggressively with county, state and federal agencies to promote and help finance more college education opportunities for minority youth. “A sure path to a solid middle-class career for our kids is a college education,” remarked Unger.
